







# Education only way to take country forward: Dr. M. Veerappa Moily

India has a window of opportunity up to the year 2035, during which proportion of working population will continue to increase due to declining fertility rates, giving India what is commonly known as the demographic dividend, said Dr. M. Veerappa Moily, Hon'ble Union Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas at KIIT University on July 27, 2013. Dr. Moily also visited Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), the largest free residential tribal institute of the world.

"Education is the most powerful weapon to fight any problem in the country", he said while expressing his happiness over the fact that KISS is providing free education to 20,000 tribal children. "After visiting KISS my heart is filled with joy, I salute Samanta's idea to eradicate poverty through education", he stated. KIIT and KISS are more developed than even the most prominent of educational institutions in South India, he said. He

thanked Dr. Achyuta Samanta, Founder of KIIT and KISS for his effort and extended his good wishes to him. Dr. Moily promised students of KIIT that he would visit again within two months and spend more time here.

Giving a picture of the employment scenario, he told the students that not everyone of the working age will be in the job market in the coming years. At present 26% of the population in 15 - 24 age group is in education, but this proportion will increase in future, the Union Minister elaborated. Similarly, some adult women will stay at home, he said, adding that presently only a third of the adult women work in India, which is low by Asian standard. India needs to create about 100 million new jobs in the next decade, he forecasted. By 2020, the average Indian will be only 29 years of age, compared with 37 in China and 45 in the U.S., 48 in Western Europe and Japan, he said. India will continue to have this age advantage for at least three decades, Dr. Moily added.

I entered the campuses of both KIIT University and Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences fifteen minutes back and my heart is full. I come from South where you must have heard Manipal, Mangalore. Till I

came here I had a lot of pride that I come from hub of institutions, where there are a number of colleges of excellence. I think my pride came down today. I bow down to great Dr. Achyuta Samanta, who single handedly built this gigantic institution.

You should go definitely to Limca Records. After having gone around the biggest campus here of the capital city Bhubaneswar, Odisha - I had gone to Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences - I could find smile with them, sunshine with them, as though Sun God has blessed them. That is the kind of smile that Dr. Samanta has brought in their face.

was so much excited that I assured the students that I will come back again within two or three months and spend four hours talking to them. I think it is a wonderful experience and I am told that 20000 tribal students - poorest of the poor - are being nurtured here. You all know that sometimes we have a wrong notion that people are intelligent by nature because of their birth in a particular family, birth in a particular race or a particular environment. This is not correct. It is the 'nurture' which gives the 'culture'. It is the 'nurture' which brings out a

personality from nowhere. This is quite possible. I am also running a school - it has only three classes and 100 students. We take people from the dropouts. We pick them up from the streets, from the fields, from hotels where they have dropped out because of poverty and so many other things. I admit persons who have the least marks. Within three years training they get 90% to 95%. This shows the talent which is within all of you.

Albert Einstein said, "I am not bothered about the talent, what is necessary is passion and curiosity." If you have the passion to learn, curiosity to go after the knowledge, you excel everybody. Einstein became so bright because of the passion and curiosity. This is how all of us should come up. I was excited to see the story of Dr. Samanta. Mother, who nurtured you, is a great power. Woman is a great power, which I understand from my own life. When I was in 4th standard, she used to wake me up at 4.30 am. She was illiterate, but still made me to read and write. She nurtured that kind of a habit with me. Today also I continue. Even when I was Chief Minister of Karnataka, one day I found that when I was doing my literature work - I normally do literature work for one or two hours in the morning - I found that a shadow was around and my mother was there watching me whether I was reading or writing or not. This is why I could write so many books. Because if I don't write what do I

> do after getting up at 4.30 in the morning? What do I do after 11.30 at night? I am just telling you - make it a habit. That gives you the real success. Education is a social process. Education is growth. Education is not preparation for life, but

education is life itself. This is what Dr. Samanta is realising. He told me - I will eradicate poverty through education. What a great statement, what a great **approach.** I have come up only because of education. I have become a chief minister, a poet, a union minister only because of education; not the status, not the caste, not the wealth, not the capital. This is how all of you should think about it. All of you are intelligent. Don't think any of your professor who says - you're not as intelligent as the other boy. No! Everybody is intelligent, but you need to discover yourself.

I was excited to see the story of Dr. Samanta. Mother, who nurtured you, is a great power. Woman is a great power, which I understand from my own life.

Education is a social process.

Education is growth. Education is not preparation for life, but education is life itself. This is what Dr. Samanta is realising.


As Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister, I started telling that you must mine your mind first. Then the oil is available, gas is available. That's why I am emboldened to say to the country that by 2030, our country is going to become energy independent. And this is possible. If we open our mind and be bold enough to take decisions, our country is going to be rich. China and America are rich because they produce 40% to 50% of their requirement. That is what we have our country is rich, we are poor. We are poor because our mind is poor. If our mind can become rich, the country will become rich. It does not require so many five year plans. It does not require so much of thinking.

This is what my illiterate father used to say to me. If your mind is rich, everything else outside will become rich. And that is the principle with which, my dear students, you need to do that.

I am very happy that many law students are here. I started the first experiment of opening a national law school university, of which there are 14 now in the country. And that national law school has now become a model. When I started it, many MLAs in the Assembly said - you are wasting money of two crore which could have been distributed among so many law colleges. I said - this is the college of the future of the country. It happened. Our law students are now much in demand in the international market. This is what education can do.

India has a window of opportunity upto the year 2035. When the proportion of working age population in the total population will increase due to declining fertility rate giving India what is commonly known as the demographic dividend. You are now here in the college at an opportune time. The future belongs to you, provided you possess that future, you own that future. There is a demographic dividend that the country could hope for and ultimately exploit and explore. A paper was brought by International Monetary Fund recently with the title 'Asia and the Pacific: Managing Spillovers and Advancing Economic Rebalancing'. They said - In many Asian countries aging population are nowcausing a decline in working age ratio.

I am emboldened to say to the country that by 2030, our country is going to become energy independent. And this is possible. If we open our mind and be bold enough to take decisions, our country is going to be rich.





The Japanese workforce has been shrinking since 1995 and the Korean workforce will start to decline beginning 2015. China's working age ratio will peak in 2013 and then decline by substantial amount in the next few decades. India's demographic transition is presently well underway. This is our future. The demographic dividend can add upto 2 percent point to per capita GDP growth per annum, according to IMF.

Nobody can prevent the march of India to the topmost position in the world. This is what you should make it. It will not be showered by anybody else. It is all within you. UN estimates suggest that changing demography will give India additional 300 million people in the working age group. This is our strength. Between 2010 and 2040 rising college education

should improve female participation sharply. There is no dividend today, but tomorrow's dividend will be pretty good more so if our policy is improved. This is what I would like to remind you about your prospects, but sharpen your knowledge with hard work.

This is the future which beholds you, but you have to achieve it. Unless you take this opportunity, the stronger countries will pass

by you. It is 250 years back USA had this kind of window of opportunity. They built their educational institutions and they built the manpower. They built infrastructure.

We will also have to grow institutions like this. Excellence should be your motto. I was appointed as the Oversight Committee Chairman by Dr. Manmohan Singh in 2005. He wanted to expand the apex institutions like IITs and

IIMs. When he wanted to expand with 27% reservation for backward classes, everybody objected to it. I gave a slogan - expand, include and excel. If you don't expand, you cannot include. You don't include, you cannot excel. Take your colleagues along with you. India's growth should be a teamwork.

Dream, boldness and determination have given Dr. Samanta power to do anything. I am very happy to associate with you. Coming to this institution is itself an inspiration. For you, studying in this institution is an inspiration which will take you along.



# Speech of Dr. M. Mangapati Pallam Raju, Hon'ble Union Minister of Human Resource Development on the occasion of **7**<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day of KiiT International School,

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen.

My esteemed and respected colleague Dr. Patasani, Hon'ble Minister of Mass Education, Govt. of Odisha Shri Rabi Narayan Nanda, Founder of the institution and KIIT and KISS Dr. Achyuta Samanta, ambassador of the school Padmashree Ruskin Bond, Principal Shri Sanjay Suar, Chairperson of the school Dr. Mona Lisa Bal, parents, teachers, members of the media and my dear students.

I am very happy to be here on the 7th Foundation Day of the school. I am happy to drive around the campuses of KIIT & KISS and to see the campus of the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) and to see the good work that has been done by Dr. Samanta. They say that the smallest good deed is better than the grandest intention. And I think intentions are professed by the governments. But it takes a lot of dedication for individuals and organisations to actually translate intentions into deeds. If we look at what Dr. Samanta has created in terms of

You children here are fortunate to be able to go to a good school like this, and have good teachers and good facilities. This is not the case with most children in India as well as in the world. To give you statistics we have one third of the world's poor in India. So it is for the Government to see that this divide is crossed and we are able to empower and enable most of our children to become responsible citizens of India.

That is why three years ago we have taken up the Right to Education Act. We have made it a Fundamental Right so that every child born in this country is able to go to school. Because of this in the last three years, to give you the latest figure today, we have about 23 crore cases who are in school in India today. And if you look at the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, there are about 11 crore children who enjoy the mid day meals in Government schools all over the country.

You all know that it is important that a country's economy grows so that it creates employment opportunity to a number of people. That is what we are looking at and since it is a much more close world today we feel that if we empower our children with education and skills today, they will not only be responsible citizens of India, but they will also be global citizens, who would

contribute to the global workforce. So we are focusing on education, we are focusing on creating a lot of skill sets in our children as they grow up. If we can ably empower our children with education and skill sets, they can propel this country to greater heights and also make a beautiful contribution to this world.

I hope that all of you will grow up well, grow up to be responsible citizen of this world. Eventually it is the quality of life that matters, and not the quantity of life. I hope all of you will empower the nation in a very rich way.





Bahuda Yatra – the return journey of the Lord – will take place on July 18, 2013.









Laxman Hembram, a 17-year old tribal student of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), Bhubaneswar participated in the Malala Day United Nations Youth Assembly at the United Nations Headquarters in New York held on July 12, 2013.

The Netherlands based Bernard van Leer Foundation (BvLF), which is funding the Multilingual Language Education Centre at KISS, facilitated his attending the Youth Assembly after being on the lookout for a suitable representative. Their interest zeroed in towards KISS knowing well that KISS has students who could proudly represent the indigenous community at a world event.

The Malala Day United Nations Youth Assembly coincided with the 16th birthday of Malala Yousafzai, Pakistani activist and a courageous advocate of universal education and girls' rights. It featured a series of events hosted by the President of the UN General Assembly and the UN Special Envoy for Global Education. In support of the United Nations Secretary - General's Global Education First Initiative, international youth leaders convened at the United Nations and in cities around the world in support of reaching the goal of having all children, especially girls, in school and learning by 2015. Laxman was the only youth leader representative from India selected for the event at United Nations Headquarters. Hailing from restive SWAT Valley of Pakistan, Malala invited wrath of Taliban for attending school and supporting girls' education. On October 9, 2012, Taliban gunmen shot Malala in the head and neck in an assassination attempt while she was returning home on a school bus. She was seriously wounded in the attack but recovered after a prolonged treatment in the U.K. Her activism and courage attracted global admiration and bagged her nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize, making her the youngest nominee for this honour in the history. Malala attended the Youth Assembly and delivered her first public speech since the shooting, dedicated to the importance of universal education. The global community came together to celebrate Malala Day to highlight the leading role that youth can play in enabling all children to get education. Mr. Ban Kimoon, UN Secretary-General, Mr. John W. Ashe, President of the UN General Assembly, Mr. Gordon Brown, UN Special Envoy for Global Education and Mr. Ahmad Alhindawi, UN Special Envoy for Youth were among those who graced the occasion. The outcome of the Youth Assembly wasa resolution urging governments, individuals and organizations to take decisive action to include every child within the fold of education.

Laxman received the invitation to attend the Youth Assembly from the Office of the President of the UN General Assembly. Son of a poor Santhal family from Mayurbhanj district of Odisha, he is one among 20,000 tribal children whom KISS has provided a hope of bright future. A student of KISS since 2006, Laxman has recently passed his +2 (Grade 12) exams and aims to become an engineer. During his studentship he has undergone English Access Program and Youth Leadership Program of US Department of State. In the past, he had the opportunity to travel to Seoul, South Korea, to present a paper on Climate Change under the United Nations Environment Program. It is a matter of great pride for KISS, tribal community and Odisha to have a tribal student from the state to represent the country at this prestigious international meet, said Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS.

In another achievement, Amrita Nayak, a tribal girl from KISS studying in +2 Science, is among 13 student-panelists from India taking part in Ground Level Panel (GLP) to discuss and comment on the recommendations of a United Nations High Level Panel (HLP) on post 2015 goals framework of Millennium Development Goals (MDP). The UN announced a 27-member HLP to advise on the global development framework beyond 2015. The panel, co-chaired by President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono of Indonesia, President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf of Liberia and Prime Minister David Cameron of the United Kingdom, has come up with their report on recommendations.

Amrita will share her experiences with poverty and how KISS is working to eradicate poverty through education. The deliberation - component of a global initiative 'Participate' - is being organized by PRAXIS, a Delhi based organization, in collaboration with KISS in New Delhi from July 14 – 19, 2013. Concurrent GLP meetings will be held in three more countries - Egypt, Brazil and Uganda. Three students from GLP would make it to the HLP. Amrita is an orphan hailing from Gajapati district. She is studying in KISS and has achieved 80% marks in Class X exam. Wishing her a bright future, Dr. Samanta said that she has made the institute, Odisha and the country proud by her achievement.

# English Access Microscholarship Program

English Access Microscholarship Program is an enriching initiative of the Department of State, United States of America, being implemented at KISS. It is largest in the country with already 550 students enrolled and being trained. It is an effective training program designed to provide significant English language experience to bright indigenous students. An appreciation of Indian and American democratic principles and culture is emphasized through this program. The program also comprises students from Primitive Tribal Groups, who are pursuing higher education. Laxman Hembram, an English Access student, has presented a paper on Climate Change in Seoul, South Korea organized by UNEP. He was also a part of the Malala Day event as a youth representative at UN Headquarters in New York, USA. Two Access students have been shortlisted by US Consulate Hyderabad, to pursue higher professional education in USA. Many Access students are now pursuing higher professional education. This program has been able to curb alienation and has contributed to mainstreaming of poor indigenous children.



Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences (KIDS), a constituent of KIIT University, along with Dentsply India conducted a Continuing Dental Education (CDE) and Hands-on Program on "Basic & Recent Advancement in Endodontics". The inaugural function was attended by Prof. P. P. Mathur, Vice Chancellor, KIIT University, Mr. R. N. Dash, Secretary, KIIT & KISS, Dr. P. D. Joshi, eminent endodontist, Prof. Dr. Ramesh Chandra Das, Principal, KIDS and Dr. J. J. Pathi, Administrative Officer, KIDS. Chief speaker of the program was Dr. P. D. Joshi, Hon. Consultant at Lilavati Hospital & Medical Research Centre, Mumbai and Panel Member of Bhabha Atomic Research Centre as Consultant Endodontist.

The CDE Program consisted of three didactic lecture sessions. During the lecture, Dr. Joshi took the delegates through all aspects of root canal treatment - both basic and recent concepts. He spoke extensively on the advancement in techniques and equipment that are being used in root canal treatment. The lecture sessions were followed by Hands On program on the use of hand and rotary protaper file system in root canal treatment. The delegates consisted of not only the staffs and students of KIDS, but also from Institute of Dental Sciences, Hi-Tech Dental College & Hospital and SCB Dental College & Hospital. A total of 130 delegates attended the CDE program. The program was very informative and a great success.

#### Free Dental Camps by Kalinga Institute of **Dental Sciences (KIDS)**

Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences (KIDS) under KIIT University conducted a Free Dental Screening and Treatment Camp on the occasion of "World No Tobacco Day" at Panchupal, Barang on 31st May, 2013. Around 150 residents of Panchupal village were screened for any dental or oral diseases. All residents were explained about the ill effects of tobacco consumption. Oral mucosal lesions were screened in all patients who had habits of tobacco smoking or chewing. Tobacco associated lesions that were detected in patients were referred to KIDS for further investigations and treatment. Banners were displayed which educated the public about the ill effects of tobacco and how it is one of the major cause of oral cancer. Moreover, a total of 82 free extractions (tooth removal) were done in the camp. Free medicines were given to all those who had extractions and even for other dental diseases. The team consisted of 14 doctors, dental students and assistants from KIDS. A team of 20 comprising doctors, dental students and assistants from KIDS performed consultation and a thorough oral screening with advanced diagnostic aids.

In the camp an Oral Cancer Screening was also done by NOCPI and various tobacco associated diseases were detected and the patients were referred to KIDS for further investigations and treatment. People were also educated about maintaining proper oral hygiene and about the ill effects of tobacco use. The Institute conducted another Free Dental Screening and Treatment Camp at Siruli Mahaveer, Dist. Puri on 28th April, 2013. The camp benefited 500 residents of Siruli Mahaveer Village who were screened for dental or oral diseases. A total of 185 free extractions (tooth removal) were done in a fully equipped Mobile Dental Van of KIDS. Free medicines were given to all those who had extractions and even for other dental diseases.

#### **KIDS Faculty Presents Paper at International Conference**

Dr. Shyam Sundar Behura of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences (KIDS), KIIT University presented a scientific paper titled 'Newer Leading-edge Techniques – Augmenting Early Oral Cancer Screening and Diagnosis' at the 35th Asia Pacific Dental Congress Conference held at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia from 7 – 12 May, 2013. The paper discussed the leading- edge screening and diagnostic aids such as vital (Toluidine blue) staining, brush biopsy, tissue chemiluminescence, autofluorescence, DNA analysis, saliva-based diagnostics and biomarkers. Some other new arrivals such as Lab-on-a-chip, O-Scan, Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) and Nano devices were also discussed in the paper, which reviewed the efficacy of the existing and new techniques in improving the early detection of malignant changes of the oral mucosa. Oral cancer remains one of the ten most prevalent cancers in the world with twothird of the cases occurring in developing countries and the cause being that oral squamous cell carcinoma (OSCC) is often diagnosed at an advanced stage. Therefore, early diagnosis of OSCC is a priority. Dr. Shyam Sundar Behura, MDS, PGDMLS, FAGE is Senior Lecturer in Department of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology of KIDS.

Aparajita Gochhikar, a MBA (Rural Management) student of School of Rural Management, KIIT University, bagged six points from 11 rounds to grab silver medal in U-20 girls category of the 19<sup>th</sup> Commonwealth Chess Championship held at Port Elizabeth, South Africa from July 5 to 14, 2013. Aparajita defeated Mofokeng Rasweu of South Africa in the 11th and last round to finish with six points. Grobellor Jasqui

(South Africa), who also garnered six points, bagged the gold on the basis of Buchholz tie-break score.

Total 314 players from 17 countries featured in this prestigious chess championship. Altogether 11 member of India contingent including Odisha's WGM Kiran Manisha Mohanty participated in the 10-day-long tournament. This is the third Commonwealth medal for Aparajita, who hails from Puri. She had claimed her first Commonwealth medal, a gold in u-18 girls category, at Johannesburg, South Africa, in July, 2011 and the second, a silver in u-20 girls category, in Chennai in December 2012. Aparajita Gochhikar, along with Dutee Chand and Laxman Hembram - two student-achievers of KIIT and KISS respectively, was felicitated by Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS at a special function organized on July 20, 2013. She expressed gratitude to KIIT and its Founder for mentoring and support. Mr. J. P. KIIT girl blazes the Athletic Championship

> Dutee Chand, a student of School of Law of KIIT University, bagged Bronze Medal in 200 metre dash at the 20th Asian Athletics Championship held in Pune from 3 – 7 July 2013 with a timing of 23.82 seconds. She finished fraction of a second behind Viktoriya Zyabkina of Kazakhstan (Gold Medal) and Asha Roy of India (Silver Medal). At 17 years, she was the youngest among 24 best athletes from different Asian countries competing in the event.

Touted as the next PT Usha, Dutee already has many records under her belt. In recently concluded 8th IAAF World Youth Championships in Donetsk, Ukraine she clocked her career best of 11.62 seconds in 100 meter dash, a national youth and junior record. Dutee was declared best athlete in National School Games in Lucknow in February 2013, bagging three golds in 100 metre, 200 metre and 400 metre. She was again adjudged best girl athlete in National Youth Athletics in Bangalore in May, winning gold in 100

and 200 metre. Her achievements have made the institute and the State proud, said Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS. KIIT provides equal emphasis to sports, said Dr. A. Samanta, while motivating her to go for Olympic medal. Born in a poor weaver's family in Odisha's Jajpur district, Dutee's dream run is fascinating.

One of the four daughters, she found a role model in her elder sister, Saraswati, who herself has represented the country at the international level. With the support and encouragement she is getting at KIIT University, she hopes to win an Olympics medal. Her national coach is confident that she will win medals for the country in the Asian Games in Incheon, South Korea and Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, Scotland, in 2014.


## Kirti-Kalpa – KIIT Art Gallery
