# NMDC Assists to Set up KISS in Kanker, Chhattisgarh

A branch of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), the largest tribal institute of the world, has been set up at Kanker (near Bastar), a tribal dominated and Naxal infested region of Chhattisgarh, with assistance from National Mineral Development Corporation (NMDC). A Memorandum of Understanding to this effect was signed between Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS and Mr. G. B. Joshi, Director, NMDC in the presence of Shri Rana Som, Chairman-cum-Managing Director at the Corporate Office of NMDC in Hyderabad on 24th June 2011. As per the agreement, NMDC has provided 30 acres of land along with all financial assistance to KISS in order to set up its replica in Kanker region of Chhattisgarh. In the first phase, 1000 tribal boys and girls will be admitted in this school. However, total 4000 students from five districts in and around Kanker & Bastar will be educated here in near future. Like in KISS, education and all facilities will be provided free of cost to the students. The School will be a model school, for which development work has already begun. Various corporate bodies have welcomed the agreement between

In past, more than 20 national level NGOs had tried to set up such school here with financial assistance from NMDC, a Navaratna PSU of Govt. of India. In view of high reputation and track record of KISS as well as abilities and dedication of its Founder, Dr. Samanta, NMDC had requested him to set up a replica of KISS in Kanker. It is learnt that that NMDC authorities have been requesting him to set up 'KISS Kanker' for more than one year. There have also been consistent requests from many State Governments to establish replicas of KISS, a model institute having no parallel in the world, in their respective states. Governments of Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Delhi are keen to set up such model school bearing all financial commitment. It is believed that KISS will definitely be helpful for tribal people of Chhattisgarh to come out of illiteracy and poverty. Setting up of 'KISS Kanker' as well as interest of various State Governments to establish this model school in their states have given KISS model a national importance, opined intellectuals, adding that this is a matter of great happiness and pride. Expressing his happiness over the development, Dr. Samanta has said that no effort will be spared to take the new beginning to a fruitful conclusion.

There have also been consistent requests from many State Governments to establish replicas of KISS, a model institute having no parallel in the world.

## Infant's Nasal Pore Opened

Doctors of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), a constituent of KIIT University, performed a rare surgery to open nasal pore of a seven-day baby. The infant with closed nasal pore, a rare condition, was born in SCB Medical College and Hospital, Katak. Parents of the baby admitted her in KIMS in a critical condition. Dr. K. K. Samantaray, ENT Expert, KIMS opened the pore after two-hour long rare surgery. Under the supervision of Dr. R. N. Biswal, Dr. Jagaddish Mishra (Anesthesia), Dr. Akshya Parida and Dr. Khageswar Rout, Dr. Samantaray applied endoscopy surgery on the infant, who was supplied oxygen for temporary respiration.

The infant is doing well after the surgery and continues to be under treatment of Dr. Manas Nayak, Dr. Jagadish Sahu and Dr. Sebaranjan Biswal in Neonatal ICU section of KIMS. "It is a rare condition that mostly afflicts girls", said Dr. Samantaray, informing that survival rate is very low in such cases. It was a challenging surgery and KIMS could handle it well because of well trained doctors and ultra modern equipments, said Dr. R. N. Samanta, CEO, KIMS. Congratulating the doctors for successful treatment of the infant, Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS said that their achievement has made KIMS proud.

## Catheter Removed from Lungs after 33 Years

Unbelievable but true. In a rare surgery, doctors of KIMS removed a malecot catheter from a man's lungs, where it was embedded for 33 years. The catheter was left in the lungs of Bipin Patro (38) of Kendrapada due to doctor's negligence when a chest drain was performed at him at SCB Medical College and Hospital, Katak to treat Pneumonia and pus in lungs in 1978. He was just five years of age then. Though he was cured of Pneumonia and pus, a part of malecot catheter was left inside lung, which caused a fistula (Thoraco cutaneous fistula). For last 33 years, Bipin was suffering from lungs pain due to this condition. When he came to KIMS, investigations by Dr. Madhabananda Kar, eminent surgeon revealed that a part of chest drain was inside the lungs. Dr. Kar decided to remove that chest drain by surgery. On 12th May 2011, a team of doctors led by Dr. Kar and constituting Dr. Subrat Mohanty, Dr Amrish Mishra, Dr. Subrat Sahoo and others successfully removed the catheter from his lungs. The team of doctors was assisted in lungs ventilation by Dr. Akshya Parida, Dr. Jagadish Mishra, Dr. Amit Pradhan, Dr. Aditya Das and Dr. Kadambini Parida. The chest drain and the damaged part of the lungs were removed. This type of surgery is very rare, informed doctors of KIMS. Dr. A. Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS congratulated Dr. Kar and his team for their effort and wished Shri Bipin Patro a long and happy life.

## Uncommon Disease, Immaculate Treatment

A two-month old baby girl was brought to KIMS with breathing problem, from which she was suffering for about one month. As her condition was serious she was admitted to Pediatric ICU. After thorough evaluation she was diagnosed to have Diaphragmatic Hernia, a birth defect in which there is a large hole in one side of diaphragm, the structure that separates chest cavity from abdominal cavity and belly. The defect allowed entry of abdominal contents, mainly liver, stomach and intestine, into chest cavity; thus, compromising and jeopardizing the development and function of the lungs. This is a rare condition and requires early diagnosis and treatment involving medical resuscitation and surgical correction. The baby was stabilized with aggressive treatment. She was successfully operated by Pediatric Surgical Team headed by Dr. Subrat Mohanty with anesthetic support from Dr. B. K. Panigrahi and his team. The baby finally recovered after intensive post operative care round the clock for one week including artificial breathing support from ventilator.

Similarly, a six-year old girl was brought to KIMS with irregular fever, skin rashes and gradual weakness in lower limbs for two months and inability to walk and run properly for 10 days. She was treated at many institutions as well as by private doctors, but without any relief, causing grief and frustration to the parents. The child was having a typical rash of a chronic debilitating disease called Dermatomyositis, which is very uncommon and occurs in one in two million population. The disease primarily affects body muscles through an abnormal autoimmune process and in the long run incapacitates the patient gradually if not diagnosed and treated early and properly. With the clinical suspicion from the typical rash, the child was investigated and the diagnosis was clinched within one week at KIMS. She was put on proper treatment and within 10 days there was marked improvement. She could walk properly, rashes subsided and persistently irritable child became cheerful. Both the cases were rare and not commonly encountered by physicians. If not diagnosed early and treated aggressively the patient succumbs or gets incapacitated for whole life. The two children were salvaged due to outstanding professional knowledge, clinical acumen, exceptional competence and utmost dedication displayed by the team of doctors from various disciplines, particularly the Department of Pediatrics, headed by Prof. Aswini Kr. Mohanty.

## Docs Solve Complicated Pregnancy

A 23 year primigravida with right sided lower abdominal pain at nine weeks of gestation was diagnosed (USG) as Heterotopic Pregnancy. This condition is marked by two parallel pregnancies - one in the uterine cavity and other in the tube. She underwent laparoscopic removal of the affected tube (Right salpingectomy), preserving the intra-uterine pregnancy, which advanced uneventfully till term with supportive measures and delivered vaginally at 37 weeks. Both the mother and the baby are doing well. The whole proceeding was a team-effort of KIMS doctors at O&G Department.

## Surgery to Treat Corrosive Poisoning of Upper GI Tract

A 25-year male patient was admitted to the Department of Surgery of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) with accidental intake of corrosive acid. The patient was initially resuscitated and managed in a private hospital in Bhubaneswar. He was then referred to KIMS with severe retrosternal burning pain. The patient developed gradual bleeding from the Upper GI Tract due to acid injury which was initially treated conservatively with blood transfusion. However, due to continued bleeding, emergency esophagogastrectomy was performed, where all the stomach and middle and lower portion of esophagus was resected. The patient recovered well in the post-operative period and was discharged with only liquid nutritional feeding through the feeding jejunostomy. The patient's general condition improved. After three months reconstructive surgery of Colon replacement as a substitute of resected esophagus and stomach was performed. The surgery was performed by a dedicated group of surgeons.

## Critical Care Training for KIMS Nurses

Intensive Care Unit of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) organized a CME-cum-Workshop on critical care for nurses of the institute on 20th June 2011. Critical care nursing is the field of nursing with a focus on the utmost care of the critically ill or unstable patients. Critical care nurses can be found working in a wide variety of environments and specialties, such as emergency departments and the intensive care units. There is worldwide increased emphasis on effective training of nurses to handle critically ill patients. Total 30 experienced nurses involved in care of serious patients all over the hospital registered for the programme and studied the pre course reading material for one week. Topics covered were 'Basic Life Support', 'Airway Management' and 'Procedures in ICU'. The lectures were delivered by the Intensive Care Unit team comprising of Dr. Tripathy, Dr. Mishra and Dr. Moharana. Prof. A. GM, by CEO, DGM, Senior manager (Marketing), ADOs and other staff members of the hospital. It was well supported by the specialists of Deptt. Of Medicine & Pulmonary Medicine.

The total patient turnover was around 160, who were examined thoroughly by checking Blood Pressure and Blood sugar levels by our doctors and were given the required medical advice for Diabetes and Hypertension. Some of the patients were called for further investigations and treatment. The hospital is planning to conduct more such camps in future to provide the health care facilities to more number of poor & needy patients of Odisha

## Indian International Education: Coming of Age

**N**ot very long ago, international schools were confined to a very small number, scattered in our largest cities, catering mostly to expatriate families or the wealthy few that could afford them. However, the past several years has seen the number of international schools growing exponentially, most of them using the word "international" by virtue of the implementation of a curriculum supported by an overseas organization such as the Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) or the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Despite continuing certain issues, the exposure to widespread international education in the country has had many positive benefits. For example, parents have generally gotten over the idea that for a school to be called international it must necessarily have foreign teachers. The quality of some foreign teachers in schools, coupled with the improved practices of local educators has demonstrated that there is more to international education than meets the eye.

**KiiT International School, Bhubaneswar, has taken rapid strides since its inception four years ago to become the only school in eastern India authorized to offer International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). Besides IBDP, it also offers International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) of University of Cambridge as international curriculum and Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) as national curriculum. As international schools settle into their place into the Indian education system, schools need to actively and creatively participate in their own development. "Even if schools implement an international curriculum, it is dry and lifeless without the whole school's involvement. **Another promising development over the past few years is the growing number of prominent universities which are now admitting students with an international Grade 12 diploma, such as the IB's Diploma Programme.** However, it is unfortunate that many talented students still need to leave the country to continue their tertiary education.

Asked about the perception that international education is an importer of values and morals from abroad, Patterson believes this is an unfortunate exaggeration. "There is no doubt that the content these curricula have been developed outside of India. Generally, I don't see that as a problem. One of my favourite quotes is from Gandhiji who said 'I want the culture of all lands to be blown about my house, as freely as possible. But I refuse to be blown off my feet by any of them'. India is rich in cultural has a many values that have deteriorated elsewhere. We can't pretend that problems elsewhere won't come here. What we can do is provide our children with the opportunities and guidance to learn how to make good decisions on their own.

## 90 Percent Result for KISS in HSC Exam

Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) has posted impressive result in High School Certificate Examination, Orissa, recording 90 percent result. 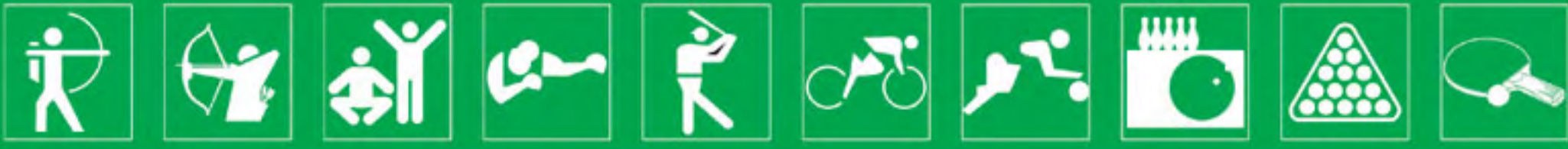

## Archery and Weightlifting Camp at KISS

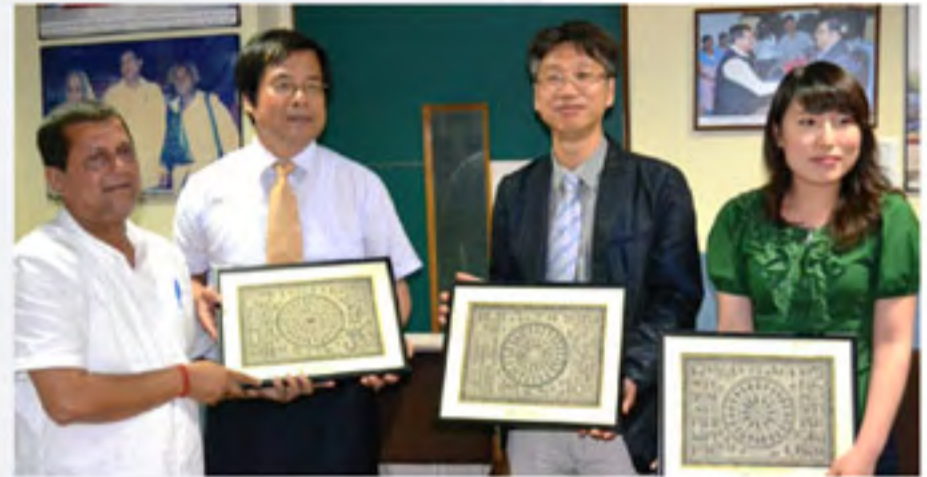

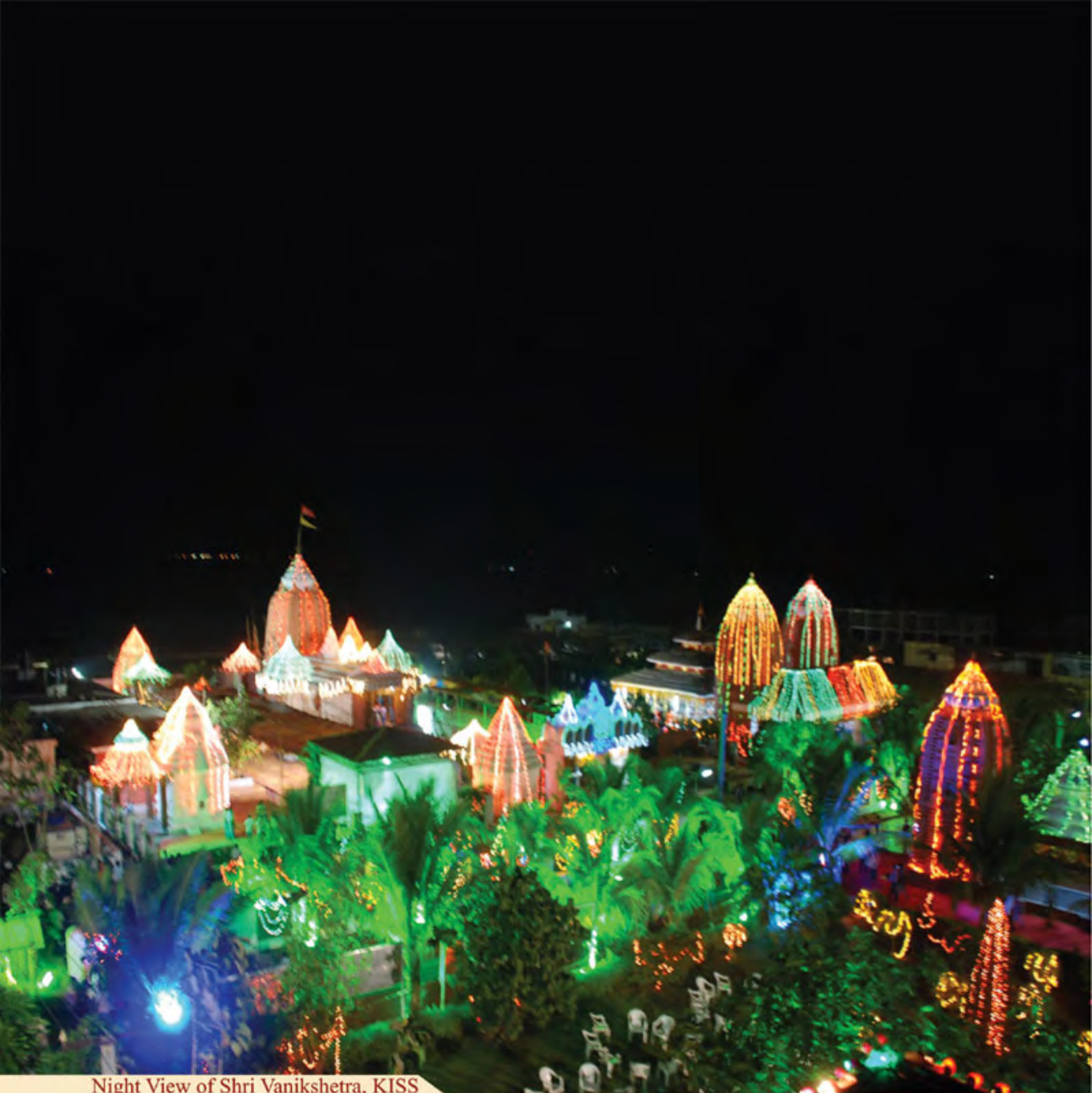
