



In recent years, KIIT team have emerged as a strong contender in the prestigious automobile design competitions organized by BAJA SAE as well as prestigious aeronautical design competition, 'Aero Design West'.

Numerous research papers authored by students have been published in reputed national and international journals. Some have authored research based books which have been accepted for publication by international publishing companies such as Lambert of Germany.

Students of KIIT University have proved their mettle in National Youth Parliament Competition and reputed Moot Court Competitions. Recently, KIIT team became the first team ever from any private university to win the prestigious Bar Council of India (BCI) Moot Court Competition.

It is because of such quality that placement for talented students of KIIT University have never been a problem, even during tough times of economic recession.

All streams of the University have been recording cent percent campus placement from their inception.

KIIT University uniquely places equal emphasis on academic placement, meticulously grooming interested students for higher studies and actively supporting their efforts to secure admission in reputed institutions. In 2013, total 159 students from different schools were academically placed, securing admission into leading institution of higher education in India and abroad.

As a university with a vision, KIIT promotes sports and games among the students, along with academics. Sports activity in KIIT University is facilitated by KIIT Stadium, Central Indoor Stadium and 10 sports complex distributed in different campuses. Sprawling over an area of 29 acre, KIIT Stadium has the capability to hold day & night matches and can seat upto 40,000 spectators.



It has facility for Cricket (turf wicket), Hockey (astroturf), Kabaddi, Football, Volleyball, Kho-Kho, Throwball, Basketball, Rugby, Handball, Netball and Track & Field (400 m).

KIIT's Central Indoor Stadium – Biju Patnaik Indoor Stadium – is the hub for indoor sports activities. It is one of the biggest in-campus indoor stadiums of the country. It has facilities for Basketball, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Billiards & Snooker (air conditioned), Chess, Carom, Health Club, 12 Station Multi-gym and Yoga Centre. In addition to these two central facilities, 10 Sports Complex are located in different campuses. Each such facility has a swimming bool, multi-gym, besides facility for other sports and tames. Efforts of the institution in the field of sports are

now showing result. Exploits of tribal students of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), a sister concern of KIIT, is already well known. In addition to winning two international tournaments in Rugy (London – 2007 & Manchester – 2011) and representing India in Commonwealth Games, Asian Games and World Youth Olympics, students from this institution have found place in Indian national team in almost all disciplines of sports. Kiran Manisha Mohanty and Aparajita Gochhikar, well known names in international chess circuit, are the students of KIIT. Similarly, KIIT has also produced prodigious athlete Dutee Chand, who is widely touted as the country's next Olympic hope.

KIIT Students Top National Formula One Car Design Competition

Team Hermes Racing of KIIT University secured the top position in the Virtual SUPRA SAEINDIA-2013, a prestigious Formula One car design competition held at KIIT University from September 20 – 21 2013.

This competition was open to all SAEINDIA Collegiate Clubs of engineering institutions, colleges and universities across the country. Students from 174 engineering colleges had participated, including teams from IITs and NITs.

KIIT Team's faculty advisor is **Prof. Isham Panigrahi**. The students who participated in the virtual round were: **Dipam Chatterjee** (Captain), Nabankur Ray (Vice-Captain), Nalam Yogesh (Technical Head), Saurav Das and Shadab Ahmed. **It topped the table among 174 participating institutions securing 83.03 percentile of marks – the highest in the event.** The second position was bagged by IGIT Women's Engineering College, Delhi with 82.30 percentile and the third position by 'Acceleraters', MIT, Pune, which secured 81.50 percentile marks. Various criteria for the competition were project plan, adherence to the rules, tri-D modeling, technical calculation, vehicle dynamics, selection of engine and its justification, selection of transmission and its justification with calculation, design of the chassis and team structure.

Judges were experts from Maruti Suzuki India Ltd, TRAKTION, PD & D, VE & CV Ltd, Defiance Technologies, TVS Motors, JK Tyres and industries. Virtual SUPRA SAEINDIA-2013 was formally inaugurated on September 20, 2013. The final list of 100 selected teams for the main event to be held in MRF race track in Chennai was announced at its valedictory ceremony on September 21, 2013. Virtual SUPRA SAE 2013 is an initiative of SAEINDIA, recognizing the need for experiential learning and increased

involvement of Indian engineering students in automotive industry. SAEINDIA launched SUPRA in 2011, providing an opportunity to engineering students to plan, design, fabricate, analyze and test a proto-type Formula type race car. SUPRA SAEINDIA starts with a qualifying event where all the registered teams are required to present their virtual design with detailed specifications complying with the defined rules. The teams selected in the Virtual SUPRA participates in the main event, where the teams are required to fabricate the proto-type based on their design reports, analyze and test it.

All the cars are evaluated using a series of static, dynamic and durability tests like design, cost evaluation, presentation, acceleration, skid-pad, auto-cross, fuel economy and endurance. Originally started in USA by SAE International as Formula SAE, such events are being organized in several countries with different names like Formula Student (UK & Germany) and FSAE (Australasia, Brazil and Italy). In India, it is being organized for the first time with Formula Student Rules from July 16 – 19, 2014.



KIIT Team Clears BAJA Virtual 2013

A team of 25 students of KIIT University has cleared BAJA Virtual – 2013, a prestigious all-terrain vehicle design competition for third time. The event was held in Bangaluru. The finals are scheduled to be held at the National Automotive Test Tracks in Pithampur of Madhya Pradesh's Dhar district from February 20, 2014. The vehicle boasts of a 305 cc Briggs and Stratton engine with 10 Horse Power. It has centralized steering, independent suspension system in all four tires, four independent wheels, rear wheel drive and air shock absorbers. The seat and body of the vehicle are made of glass fiber composite for lightness and better strength. The Mechanical Engineering students under the guidance of Prof. Isham Panigrahi will be designing and fabricating the vehicle in the college manufacturing facility to compete with the 125 other teams from all across the country for the prestigious Mahindra and Mahindra Mini Baja SAE India 2013.








School of Computer Engineering and School of Electronics Engineering, which accounts for the highest number of registered students, already have more than 60% conversions in campus placement drives.

The placement season, which started with Shapoorji & Pallonji, has attracted 16 companies within only two months. With 523 selections, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) was the top recruiter in terms of

number of job offers. For the seventh year in a row, TCS has the distinction of being the top recruiter at KIIT University. It was followed by Wipro Technologies which doled out 153 offers. Capgemini selected 62 students, whereas 4 students got offer from Accenture off-campus drive. Similarly, Gyansys selected 3 students. The highest CTC so far of Rs. 6.25 lakh has been offered by the American IT multinational, Hewlett-Packard (HP), which picked up 23 students in the profile of R&D engineers. Intel India closely followed with a salary package of Rs. 6.20 lakh. Deloitte U.S. India, which recruited 39 students, offered a CTC of Rs. 5.46 lakh.





The average salary package stands at Rs. 3.40 lakh. Other companies that visited KIIT campus are: MU-Sigma, Cybage Software (P) Ltd., Zentron Labs (P) Ltd., Adstuck and SAP Labs India. Cybage, Adstuck and HP are the new value additions to list of campus visiting companies.



Apart from campus placement, there is a growing trend in recent years among KIIT students to go for higher studies in reputed national and foreign institutions.








KIIT University has been achieving record cent percent campus placements since 2001, when the first batch of engineering students graduated.





Hectic preparations are on to launch the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO)'s ambitious Mars Orbiter Mission in November 2013, said Prof. U. R. Rao, Chairman, PRL Council of the Department of Space, Govt. of India at KIIT University on September 6, 2013. The unmanned mission, which will explore the existence of life and the possibility of sustaining life on Mars, will travel 299 days in space before reaching the Red Planet in September 2014, he informed. The Mars Orbiter Mission will be sent through powerful PSLV-XL launch vehicle.

Prof. U. R. Rao, who led the country's space programme between 1984 and 1994 as chairman, ISRO, was delivering a talk to the students and faculty of KIIT University on "Existing Challenges in Space Programmes of Future". Country's space programme has crossed notable milestones, he stated, informing that it was Chandrayaan-1 of India that first discovered water on Moon. The country spends Rs. 3148 cr. on space programme per year and has a 16,500 strong human resource expertise, he said, while outlining the nine challenges for the space programme as: food security, energy security, environmental security, resource security, space security, space transportation, search for life, exploring universe and colonisation of Mars.

The noted space scientist delved on fascinating scenario of colonisation of Mars. Steps may involve use of reflector to melt ice on Mars habitat with nuclear power, spread cyano-bacteria and start photosynthesis, increasing oxygen level,



Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences (KIDS), a constituent of KIIT University, conducted a free dental screening and treatment camp at Sudhir Jagdev Sanskrit College for the residents of Nandigoda, Kanas in Puri district on September 1, 2013. National Oral Cancer Prevention Initiative (NOCPI) conducted ORACAMP to spread awareness about oral cancer and to make early detection of oral cancer and other oral diseases having possibilities to develop into cancer. A total of 132 residents of Nandigoda were screened for any dental or oral diseases. Oral mucosal lesions were checked in all patients who had habit of tobacco smoking or chewing. Tobacco associated lesions that were detected in patients were referred to KIDS for further investigations and treatment. In the camp, 68 free extractions (Tooth Removal) were done. Free medicines were given to all those who had extractions as well as other dental diseases. Banners on oral cancer were displayed in the camp and an awareness talk on the subject was delivered by NOCPI. The team from KIDS consisted of an oral pathologist, oral surgeon, dental surgeon, interns and assistants.

Joint Replacement Course at KIMS

Orthopedics Department of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) has started a Joint Replacement Training Center to train young orthopedic surgeons with the help of Depoy Synthes Institute. The centre conducted a basic Arthroplasty workshop of hip and knee from July 26 – 27, 2013. As a leading institute in the eastern zone, KIMS has taken the initiative to train young orthopedics. The workshop was meant for surgeons who are performing joint replacement surgery with assistance and were eager to become independent operators. This was the first of its kind of course conducted in Odisha. The programme was organized by KIMS in association with Odisha Orthopedics Association. Dr. Basanta Kumar Behera, Associate Professor and Senior Joint Replacement Surgeon organized organizing and co-coordinating the programme, while Prof. Dr. U. N. Mishra, eminent orthopedic specialist of Odisha chaired.

Arthritis of joints is a common problem now-a-days. Osteoarthritis of knee is common among the age group of above 45-50 years. Similarly Rheumatoid arthritis is common among the age group of 20-40 years. Arthritis commonly affects knee and hip joints, causing destruction of the affected joint. The arthritic joint becomes swollen, deformed and painful because of which the patient is unable to walk and starts limping. In severe cases the patient cannot walk; becomes bedridden and depends on his family members for daily activities. These patients require joint replacement of hip or knee for the relief of pain and to restore the mobility of joint.

Around 1% of the country's population over the age of 60 is suffering from osteoarthritis of knee. A large number of people are suffering from severe osteoarthritis of knee which requires joint replacement, as severe cases cannot be treated by medicine or physiotherapy. Till date 50,000 arthritis patients are waiting for Total Knee Replacement every year in our country, but only 10,000 patients are being operated every year and the load is still increasing. This waiting period is due to the lack of sufficient number of Joint Replacement Surgeons and well equipped Joint Replacement Centers in our country. Joint Replacement Training Center is an initiative of KIMS to improve the situation.

Hepatitis Week Observed at KIMS

Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), a constituent of KIIT University, organized a week-long Hepatitis awareness programme on the occasion of World Hepatitis Day from July 29 to August 3, 2013. Total knee replacement is the gold standard treatment for severe osteoarthritis knee. With a success record of hundreds of such surgeries, Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), a constituent of KIIT University, occupies a place of leadership in conducting this procedure. KIMS, which handles about five knee and hip replacement cases every week, has introduced Sigma PS150 High-Flex Knee System, the most advanced knee replacement implant available in the world. Also known as the 'Fourth Generation Knee Implant', KIMS is now among only a few centers in India to offer this knee replacement option.

The Sigma PS150 High-Flex Knee System affords the patient advantages of near normal knee motion and less of wear and tear, according to Dr. Basanta Kumar Behera, Associate Professor, Dept. of Orthopedics. Flexion is the action of bending a joint, such as the elbow or knee. While full flexion in a normal human being rarely exceeds an angle of 165 degrees, knee flexion of more than 130 degree is not necessary in most of our daily activities. The new implant accommodates up to 150 degrees of flexion, compared to only 110 to 115 degrees of postoperative range of motion (ROM) possible in case of other contemporary implants.

Postoperative range of motion is dependent on several factors, including surgical technique and the implant design, besides the patient's age, gender, body-mass index, history of previous surgery and the preoperative ROM. The alignment and placement of the implants, removal of bone and soft tissue and balancing of the soft tissue with the new device can interfere with flexion at the time of surgery. Similarly, most contemporary TKA implants are not designed to permit flexion beyond 120 degrees.

In addition to offering wider ROM, the PS150 has rotating platform, which allows more natural movement leading to lower wear rates in the long run. The mobile bearing or rotating platform (RP) knee is designed to allow the bearing to twist and turn, letting the knee rotates up to 20 degrees as it bends, explained Dr. Behera.

The Sigma PS150 High-Flex Knee System is the latest design in the High Flexion Knee Systems part of the Sigma Knee System, which has a proven clinical heritage of 27 years.

Originally designed for people who required more flexion in their professional, cultural and religious environments, especially in India and various Asian countries, it is increasingly being preferred with the declining age of patients undergoing knee replacements.Dr. Behera believes PS150 is ideally suited for the modern Indian patients. Apart from lesser bone cut, it provides additional stability in high flexion activities and smooth tracking of the patella (knee cap) hence reducing chances of knee pain after surgery.

KIMS has performed knee replacement surgery in even 100 years old patient in its state-of-the-art Joint Replacement Operation Theatre. Similarly, such procedure has also been performed on obese patient weighing more than 100 kg. The new implant will


