

KISS Student Nominated for International Children's Peace Prize

Sumitra Nayak, a student of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), has been nominated for the prestigious International Children's Peace Prize - 2017. She is among 10 Indian kids nominated for the prize. "My vision of this world is where every child grows up to be a change-maker continuously aiming to solve problems around them and gets to build empathy as a skill. This will change the world", says Sumitra.

Sumitra hails from a very poor tribal family of Jajpur district. Her early childhood was marred by domestic violence and acute poverty. However, her life changed for the better after joining KISS in 2008. Here, she developed interest for Rugby. The institute, which has world-class sports facility, provided professional coaching to her and groomed her into an international Rugby player.

Under 13 Girls International Rugby Tournament in London in 2014. Earlier this year, she led the U-19 Indian girls' rugby team in 'Paris World Games'.

"She has been training her juniors ever since, and is planning a residential school in her village, where education and sport would go hand in hand, especially for girls. The team's journey from the depths of Odisha to the international centres of Dubai and London has already inspired

many students at KISS to join up. Sumitra is an inspiration to children to overcome their challenges to pursue their dreams", says her profile in the official award website.

Apart from her achievements in sports, Sumitra had the distinction of delivering a talk on child rights at 'TEDx' platform in Pune.

The International Children's Peace Prize is awarded annually to an exceptional child, whose courageous or otherwise remarkable actions have made a difference in improving children's rights, which helps children worldwide. Nobel laureate Malala Yousafzai (2013), Abraham M. Keita (2015) and Kehkashan Basu (2016) are among the past recipients of the award.

The prize was launched by KidsRights during the 2005 World Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates



at the Capitol in Rome, chaired by Mikhail Gorbachev. Since then, the prize has been presented every year by a Nobel Peace Laureate. The International Children's Peace Prize is an initiative of Marc Dullaert, Chairman and Founder of the KidsRights Foundation.

By providing all kinds of support and care, KISS and its Founder Achyuta Samanta have changed the lives of thousands of tribal children coming from very poor backgrounds, opined intellectual mass of Odisha. Sumitra is the one example from among thousands of students, whose lives have been changed, they said, appreciating the role of KISS.

Sumitra Nayak: From School Dropout to **Captain of Indian Rugby Team**

India is rich, but the people are poor. There are more mouths to eat than hands to feed. Rising India can move ahead and shine only when the poor get a decent standard of living, feel empowered and get an aim in their lives beyond the struggle for food. The difference between struggle and success is the availability of opportunities. Education, as a major opportunity, acts as the main bridge between deprivation and empowerment.

Given opportunities, anyone can excel. With a strong adherence to this principle, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), a home for over 27,000 tribal children who get free education from Kindergarten to Post Graduation in a fully residential campus, started humbly in 1992-93. Over 10,000 students have already graduated and created ripples of positive change in their community.

KISS is engaging in a massive nationbuilding task of providing free and enabling access to quality education and imparting transformative leadership skills to children from Indian indigenous communities. It seeks to leave an indelible legacy in the making of a new inclusive, awakened and resurgent India.


There have been numerous stories of change and achievement in this institution, each student being an incredible story of overcoming adversities. The students have excelled in academics and extracurricular activities. They have moved to create a name for themselves in prestigious National and International arenas challenging the quagmires of poverty, hunger and alienation.

One such powerful story is of Sumitra Nayak, who rose from the misfortune of domestic violence and abject poverty to become the captain of U-18 India Women's Rugby team.

Sumitra, a tribal, was born in Odisha's Jajpur district. Her father, a daily wage labourer with limited income spent whatever little he earned on country liquor. He didn't give any money for the sustenance of the family of five, including two siblings, besides Sumitra. As a result, Sumitra's mother had to work as a domestic help in a few houses.

The father used to return home late and often abused the mother and beat her. The little money her mother struggled

and earned was spent for bringing up her three children, only if she could save it from the husband. He used to forcefully take all the money that the mother earned for his liquor. Such torture and inhuman treatment by him kept on increasing day by day. Sumitra and her siblings grew up in such tragic circumstances. Sometimes they had to starve nights together.

Once, when the mother refused to give him money, he locked the house and set it on fire with the rest of the family inside. They somehow managed to escape with the help of villagers. But that was the turning point in her mother's life when she made a decision to leave the village and settle somewhere else with her children.

Sumitra's mother understood that she will not be able to bring her children up properly in the village. She decided to flee. When the pathos increased, she brought siblings and seven-year-old Sumitra to Bhubaneswar with an aim to provide a better life to her children.

In a new city, with a lifestyle much different than in her village, Sumitra's mother Gayatri, initially struggled for a job. Unable to find any, she was forced to work as a maid for long hours in four households, in order to provide basic facilities to her children. She used to go out to work as a domestic help, while Sumitra babysat. She dropped out of school to take care of her younger siblings.

While working at one of the houses, Gayatri learned about KISS from the benign owner, who was moved by her struggle. Gayatri found KISS as the most awaited miracle to change the



lives of her children, thinking that they will at least get food to eat without any struggle and grow up in a secure environment. She enrolled Sumitra in KISS in 2008, without a second thought.

Sumitra was instantly drawn to a 'strange game,' which her friends informed was called 'rugby,' and soon she was inclined towards this sport. It was love at first sight with rugby for her as she was not very interested in studies. She loved sports, but had never got an opportunity to play, burdened by the pressures of family and discouraging attitude of the villagers. Fortunately for Sumitra, she could follow her heart, backed by support from KISS.

Sumitra started rugby practice in 2009, but found it difficult to master the skills. The coaching at KISS made her emerge as a credible player. In 2012, she played her first State match. Two years later, she participated in the U-13 Girls' Rugby World Cup, followed by the National Championship and the National School Games. She helped her team clinch the bronze medal in the Asian Girls' Rugby Sevens (U-18) held in Dubai last year. She was the captain of the Indian team in U-18 India Girls' Rugby team to participate in 2017







Paris World Games held at the Stade Georges Carpentier, Paris. The other five teammates were also from KISS, who have equally marvellous stories of transformation.

Inspired by her feats, she was invited to deliver a TED talk in Pune last year for sharing her story on the theme "Why not"! She is a confident and empowered girl aiming to work for her community. A girl who had not moved outside her village, not even traveled on a train, took a flight by a leap of faith to London for World Cup Rugby in 2013. Now, she is well traveled, has seen five countries and almost whole of India.

Her siblings are also studying at KISS. She passed her Higher Secondary Examination with first division and currently studying Political Science in KISS.

Asked how life has changed post-KISS, Sumitra says, "KISS has given meaning to my life. In fact, for me, KISS is life." The content of institutions like KISS lies in the success of the students and the incredible transformative power it holds with itself to emerge as the picture of Shining India. The innate smile of the students, their capacity to aspire and confidence to achieve excellence have made KISS a stand-alone example to be emulated.



Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha Inaugurates KISS Higher Education Campus

"Education is the key to transformation", said Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha during his visit to Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) to inaugurate the higher education campus of the newly declared KISS University on September 2, 2017. He also inaugurated the newly built library-cum-learning centre sponsored by Tata Steel. KISS has been providing formal education from

KG to PG since 1992 – 93. Subsequent to declaration of KISS as a university, graduate, postgraduate, Ph.D. and other higher education programmes will be imparted under KISS University. For this, Founder, Achyuta Samanta had already set up a beautiful higher education campus three years ago.

Apart from the worldclass library-cum-

reading room, facilities at the new campus include academic block, administrative block, magazine lounge, exclusive girls hostel, kitchen, dining hall (1200 capacity), sewerage treatment plant, water filtration plant, rain water ground recharge system and roof top garden.

Addressing 27,000 students of KISS, Shri Patnaik said, KISS is the leading tribal institute in the world. He congratulated staff, faculties and management of KISS for getting university status. "KISS is pride of Odisha. It will bring more recognition to the State after getting university status", the Chief Minister said. He urged the students to take initiatives to give proper education to those children who are still deprived of education in their locality. He exhorted the students to try and change their family as well as their locality and community.

"Education is the real game changer and for this the Govt. of Odisha has established around 5000 hostels for the tribal students, where 5 lakhs tribal students are pursuing their study", he added. 

It is really a delight coming to KISS and KIIT. I was humbled this morning when Dr. Achyuta Samanta came with bouquet of flowers to receive me at Bhubaneswar airport. It was indeed humbling. I am impressed with the humble beginning of Dr. Samanta and his humanity.







In the previous issues of KIIT Review, we had published our conversation with Suman Saurav Mohanty and Avishyant Panda. Satyabrata Das and Rajesh Verma of KIIT REVIEW also talked to Haris Bin Zaman to know the secrets of his success. We are confident that success stories of our alumni will be a source of inspiration for thousands of IAS aspirants from the State and KIIT University, in particular.



Interview with Haris Bin Zaman



Q. Tell us something about yourself? Where have you done your schooling and graduation and in which field/discipline?

I belong to Ranchi district of Jharkhand. I did my schooling from DPS Ranchi. I am a public speaker, a sincere reader and an occasional writer. I was lucky to be a part of vibrant 2008-12 batch of KIIT University in Electronics & Telecommunications discipline.



Q. What was your aim behind appearing for the Civil Services exam? Was becoming a Civil Servant your childhood dream or did you wish to appear for it after you became aware of the importance of a civil servant?

C i v i I services offers you right balance of discretion, independence and power to bring about a difference in life of the people living at the margins. It was always my dream to become a bureaucrat, which essentially is not a career but service to people in the large realm of system.

Q. There was a wave of pride and happiness in KIIT as the result was published. Were you expecting to be in the Merit

List and how did you feel after you knew your result?

I always had a unique connection with KIIT, where the saying goes once a KIITian always a KIITian. Wherever I was, I used to follow the news of KIIT. So

I can boast that I personally saw the happiness after the result.

I was honoured and humbled. Civil Services being one of most difficult exam makes it very uncertain in nature but I also believe that with sincerity and commitment this exam can be easily cracked. Honestly speaking I was expecting positive results.

Q. Which optional paper did you choose in the Mains exam?

My optional was Sociology.



Q. What parameters should the candidates, especially graduates of professional courses, keep in mind while choosing the Optional paper?



One needs to study the optional paper in great detail and depth. Interest in the subject is the most important criteria. Availability of course material and guidance are also vital. I think if these things are kept in mind, students from professional courses can do very well.

Q. More than 4,59,000 candidates appeared the exam and only a little over 1000 got through. This makes it one of the toughest exams of the world. What are your secrets of success, what contributed to your success?

There is no secret and shortcut to success in this exam. Strategy



matters the most. Understanding the syllabus and pattern of questions and adjusting to the demand of examination are very important. Hard work, dedication and devotion are needed for some months. Aspirants should be honest to themselves and success will come running to them.

Q. How did you start your preparation? Should one prepare first for the Prelims and then the Mains?

I mostly started my preparation while I was working in Gurugram. There is no water tight compartment in the syllabus so ideally one should prepare both for Prelims and Mains simultaneously.

Q. How much time is ideal to prepare for the Civil Services exam? What was your strategy for this exam? How much time did you dedicate to your preparation?

> One to 1.5 year is all you need to prepare for this exam. I used to study with a timeline but not specifically 14 hours a day (as it is believed).

Unders tanding the subject matter and changing dynamics are important to secure rank.

Q. Did you take any coaching to crack the exam? Is it possible to crack without any coaching? If yes, please elaborate on how one can achieve this?

I did not take coaching for general studies, but for optional since it was a new subject for me. Every year scores of students qualify without coaching and it's not a surprise. Internet has emerged as one of the better source of preparation. Every one cannot travel to Delhi so it's very important for aspirant to use information on net judiciously. Internet has greatly democratised the preparation dynamics.

> Q. What kinds of questions are asked in the Personal Interview?

UPSC calls the final stage as personality test. Question s are asked on some broad theme to check the suitability of candidate in important positions. The major areas are state background, graduation subject, hobbies, interest, optional subject and current affairs.





Life Saving Surgery for Massive Airway Injury Following Road Traffic Accident (RTA) at KIMS

Airway Injury (Laryngeal trauma) is a dire emergency and life-threatening condition with high mortality rate. It usually occurs following Road Traffic Accident (RTA). However, due to the potentially life-threatening nature of such injuries, it is crucial that relevant clinicians are aware of the key principles surrounding initial assessment and management. Since such cases are infrequently encountered, confidence in managing these cases is variable. There is a wide range of presenting signs and symptoms, which may not correlate with severity of injury; hence, severe injuries may be missed.

The Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) protocol is indicated for any individual who is severely injured. In keeping with this protocol, the initial priority is to assess and secure the airway in any patient who has suffered laryngeal trauma. Once deemed stable, the airway should be further

evaluated using flexible fibre optic laryngoscope to assess the extent of laryngeal injury. This is a critical step in the initial assessment of patients

having laryngeal trauma. Such measures have been shown to increase patient survival and improve long-term functional outcomes, pertaining to breathing, speech and swallowing. Here, a case of massive laryngeal trauma, which was managed successfully, is presented.

A 23 year old male suffered from a road accident on 26th of August, 2017. He underwent treatment at SCB Medical College and was referred to KIMS for further improvement. On examination, a penetrating wound in mid line of neck was found. There was crico-tracheal separation interiorly with shattered cricoids cartilage. There was bleeding due to injury to anterior Jugular vein. The patient got admitted in

ICU, where trachea was secured and portex tracheotomy tube (7.5 mm) inserted. The patient was planned for crico-tracheal repair under General Anaesthesia.

Intra-operative findings:

There was anterior separation of cricoids cartilage and trachea, cricoids cartilage was shattered and also trachea was shattered. Neo — Tracheotomy was performed. Endotracheal Stent (6mm) was kept to prevent future stenosis. Extra mucosal crico-tracheal repair of cricoids and trachea were done. Stent was secured with skin suture and the wound was closed in layers. The Surgery was done by Dr Anil Kumar Dash and Dr Pradipta Ranjana Sahoo of Department of ENT, KIMS.

Indian Academy of Oral Medicine and Radiology National Post Graduate Convention- 2017



In recent times, there have been rapid advances in management of Oral Diseases. It is prudent to update the current concepts in Oral Medicine and Radiology. Oral Medicine and Radiology as a specialty in dentistry has a wide scope to contribute to optimum oral health. Department of Oral Medicine and Radiology, Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, KIIT University hosted the "Indian Academy of Oral Medicine and Radiology (IAOMR) National Post Graduate Convention from 4th-5th August 2017" which was a forum aimed to converge the experienced faculties and younger students to

exchange their ideas and interact with one another. The theme of the convention was "Progressions in Oral Medicine & Radiology."

The primary focus of this convention was on "Multiple Criteria Decision Analysis". During this convention senior faculties shared their experiences on management and recent advances on treating various oral diseases as well as directions for future research. Postgraduates with their scientific paper and poster presentations had an opportunity to showcase their acumen and learning. Preconference Workshops on "Practice based research network" and "Informed Consent and Assent in Human Subjects Research" had also been arranged. More than 500 delegates had registered for the convention across the country. The two day scientific sessions comprised of more than 400 research papers and 50 posters. Eminent Guest Speakers were invited from across the globe. The Chief Guest for the convention was Dr. Namita Mahapatra, Scientist FICMR, Bhubaneswar. The organisers on behalf of KIDS expressed their gratitude to Prof. Achyuta Samanta, Founder KIIT & KISS, for his encouragement to host such a significant event. They also commended Prof. Dr. R.C. Das, Prof Dr. B.N. Dutta, and Dr. Jugajyoti Pathi who were the guiding pillars for grand success of this event.

For the first time in Odisha **Device Closure of Mitral Paravalvular Leak**

A 58 years old male patient underwent Mitral Valve Replacement in 2010 at Bhubaneswar with metallic prosthetic valve (TTK Chitra Valve). It was found that, the patient had paravalvular leak (PVL) following surgery. In fact, PVL is characterized by presence of leak in the suture line of the prosthetic valve. Postsurgery, the patient remained symptomatic with difficulty in breathing due to presence of paravalvular leak (PVL). Earlier, the patient had consulted with many cardiologists in Odisha and outside and was advised to undergo redo surgery. But considering the high risk of complications in redo surgery, the patient was reluctant for repeat operation.

At last, the patient turned up to KIMS in May 2017. After clinical evaluation, Transoesophageal Echocardiography (TEE) was done and it was revealed that there was a large paravalvular leak. He was advised for device closure of PVL. The procedure was done under general anesthesia and live TEE. First the defect was profiled in detail in 3D TEE. The defect was crossed retrogradely from left ventricle into the left atrium. The size of


the leak was found to be 4.5mm in TEE. Six mm Amplatzer Duct Occluder II (ADO II 6/6) was deployed successfully across the leak. The defect was completely sealed. Post-operative echocardiography showed normally functioning prosthetic mitral valve and no paravalvular leak.

The procedure was done by Dr. Anupam Jena, Cardiologist, KIMS, 3D TEE was done by Dr. Ashok Badamali, Cardiac Anaesthesist, KIMS and Dr. Sanjay Rout, Junior Consultant Cardiologist, KIMS. Such complicated procedure has been done for the first time in Odisha by the Cardiology team of KIMS.

Paravalvular leak (PVL) occurs when there is backflow around a prosthetic valve. Paravalvular Leak is accompanied by regurgitation and is often regarded as a significant problem for patients with prosthetic heart valves. Often manifesting as heart failure (85 % of all presenting symptoms) and haemolysis (13-47 % of all presenting symptoms and signs), PVL has a prevalence rate as high as 5-17% of all mechanical valves.



How can PVL be treated? Unfortunately, repeat surgery portends a worse prognosis, with mortality rates for the first redo, second redo or third redo surgery of 13 %, 15 %, and 35 %, respectively. Each repeat operation is less likely to be successful. In fact, redo surgery for PVL is a risk factor for further PVL. Therefore, there is ample room for percutaneous approaches. Percutaneous closure is technically challenging procedure, but obviates the need for a redo cardiac surgery.
