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



"Commonwealth Big Lunches will be an opportunity for people across the Commonwealth to come together and, over a shared meal, discover and celebrate their connections, experiences and stories", said Madam Theresa May.

It also marked the first time when so many High Commissioners and representatives from British High Commission had lunch together, with 30000 children and staff of KISS at the same time and savor vegetarian and chicken lunch

together. At KISS, the dignitaries unfurled the flags of their respective countries and inaugurated the Commonwealth Room, which will be a mark of the commemoration of the Commonwealth Big Lunch. It will remain a history written in golden letters.

For KISS, it was an extended daily activity. KISS Mega Kitchen has been providing more than 1 lakh meals per day for the last 25 years on an average. It had also hosted a Grand Luncheon in 2011 with the Chief Justice of Supreme Court and High Courts, judges and legal luminaries under the leadership of former Chief Justice of India Late Altamas Kabir.





Further, the autonomous universities will be free to sign academic collaborations with the world's top universities.

The achievement is very special as KIIT is relatively a very young institution – 20 years of existence and 15 years as a university. The liberalized regime in the education sector links autonomy with quality and KIIT is proud to be one among only 60 universities in India to be accorded with this status.

Prof. B. B. Pande, Chair Professor, Criminal Law Centre, National Law University, Delhi delivered the Y. V. Chandrachud Memorial Lecture on 'Constitutional Foundations of Criminal Justice Under Tension' at KIIT School of Law on March 16, 2018.

Placing his deliberation, Prof. Pande said, "Criminal justice speaks the power of the most discarded outcastes. Without the culpability, we can't make Criminal Law. Moreover, the Criminal Law should maintain the equality principle. As you can't make a distinction between good and bad criminal, likewise you can't make any distinction between good and bad victim".

He further said that punishment should be proportionate with crimes of wrongdoing. Equal treatment to one and all should be followed. Actually there is an inconsistency with the Fundamental Rights. "Tension is shaping up the constitutional edifice and encounter has become part of Criminal Justice. Despite all these shortcomings, we have to preserve hope and nurture foundations

of Criminal Justice," added Prof. Pande. Earlier, Prof. N. K. Chakrabarti, Director, KIIT School of Law welcomed and felicitated Prof. B. B. Pande. He also placed a brief introduction of Prof. Pande before the audience.

Eminent Economist Mr. Anil Bokil Delivers Talk at KIIT

The common man, mostly farmers, suffers the most due to siphoning of public funds, burgeoning black money and rampant corruption at top bureaucratic and political levels. The corrupted system often constricts flow of resources smoothly to one and all. As a consequence, the system often compels the farmers to commit suicide and makes youth criminals or terrorists, he elaborated.

"To face the burning problem of unemployment, we need resources rather than just money. Despite having enormous talent, we lack resources to compete with our counterparts. Human resources are burning in the unorganized sector despite having the



lions' share of manpower. Whereas the organized sector has only 10% of the total work force, which witnesses capital burning", Mr. Bokil said.

"At this juncture what we have to do is to provide some relief to senior persons and simultaneously mitigate frustration of youth. A mixed human workforce is therefore the need of the hour where the experience of the seniors and talent of the youths would fetch best possible outcome. Through this way, our nation would make itself capable enough to compete with its foreign counterparts", he told the students.

Earlier, introducing the distinguished speaker to the audience, Prof. Hrushikesha Mohanty, Vice Chancellor, KIIT Deemed to be University said that Mr. Anil Bokil is originally a mechanical engineer, who eventually became one of India's leading economists and founded an NGO namely "Arthakranti Sansthan". "The decision of banning notes of 500 and 1000 denomination in India by the Government on November 8, 2016 was based on Arthakranti Sansthan's proposal put forwarded by Mr. Bokil and his team", the VC informed.
