




Message from the Founder KIIT & KISS





Star sprinter of KIIT Dutee Chand scripted history as she clinched two Silver Medals for India in women's 100m and 200m race at the 18th Asian Games in Jakarta on August 26 & 29, 2018. Taking on a stacked field in both the events, she clocked 11.32 and 23.20 seconds, missing Gold Medal by a whisker on both the occasions.

Dutee's performance in 100m equals best ever by India in this blue riband event of Athletics in the Asian Games. She has also become the first Indian woman in 32 years

to win medals in both 100m and 200m events at an Asian Games. Last time legendary P. T. Usha had achieved that feat in 1986.

In a photo finish among top three athletes, Odiong Edidiong of Bahrain pipped her by mere 0.02 seconds in 100m for Gold Medal, while defending champion Wei Yongli of China took the bronze in 11.33. The last time India won anything in an Asian Games 100m race was two decades ago in 1998, with Rachita Mistry's bronze. Dutee's time makes her the second fastest woman in Asia. Standing in 200m was an exact repeat of the top three places in 100m sprint final. Dutee had clocked 23.00 in 200m semi-final to notch the top spot —

her personal best. This was her first Asian Games and, given the strong field, experts had not given her much of a chance. But 22-year old KIIT sprinter believed in herself. "I ran the last 30 metres almost with my eyes closed. I was pushing myself that much. At the end, I wasn't sure if I even had the medal. When my name was announced, it was like a dream come true for me. I could not express my happiness at that moment. Moving around the stadium with our country's flag was a moment of pride for me", Dutee said after the dramatic

finish of 100m race.

She has also become the first Indian woman in 32 years to win medals in both 100m and 200m events at an Asian Games. Last time legendary P. T.

Usha had achieved that feat in 1986.

She trained for this moment over the last four years. "I trained like I had for no other competition. When people were training for four hours each day, my coach N. Ramesh sir would make sure I trained for six", she said, crediting her coach, a Dronacharya awardee, for her success. Dedicating her medals to the countrymen, who always prayed for her and blessed her, she expressed gratitude to Prof. Achyuta Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS for his support at all junctures. Next she wants to win Olympic medal for the country.

The news of her victories triggered spontaneous celebrations in Odisha,

including her village Chaka Gopalpur in Jajpur district and KIIT Deemed to be University, where she is pursuing law degree. Congratulatory messages have poured in from all quarters. Dutee Chand was born on 3rd February 1996 to Chakradhar Chand and Akhuji Chand in Chaka Gopalpur, in Jajpur district of Odisha. She is one of four daughters born to the poor weaver couple. When Chand was born, her parents lived below the poverty line, earning less than Rs.3,000 a month. For the family, sports was their way out of poverty. By the time Chand was 10, her older sister Saraswati was already a national level athlete. Chand too got her break — she won a sports scholarship in a government school in Bhubaneshwar. By the time Chand was 17, she was setting records on the track. Her source of inspiration came from her elder sister, Saraswati, a well-known athlete herself. In 2013, Prof. Samanta spotted Dutee and brought her to KIIT, where she is pursuing law degree. Since then, he has been giving her all types of support and guiding her till today.

In 2012, she became the national champion in the under-18 category when she clocked 11.8 seconds in the 100m event. Clocking 23.81 seconds, Dutee won the bronze in the 200m event at the Asian Championships in Pune. In the same season, she became the first Indian to run 100m final in the World Youth Championships. She set new national record in 100m and 200m, clocking 11.73 s and 23.73 s respectively at the National Senior Athletics Championships in Ranchi.

Unstoppable Dutee Chand went on to run 100m dash in 11.33 sec in the 2016 Federation Cup National Athletics Championships in New Delhi to win the gold and erase Rachita Mistry's national record of 16 years. She became the first female Indian athlete in over three decades to qualify and participate in 100m race at Rio Olympics 2016. In 2017, at Asian Athletics Championships, Bhubaneswar she clinched two bronze medals, one in the Women's 100m, another in the Women's 4×100m relay.

Dutee's dream run has not been without hurdles. She was suspended by the IAAF in 2014 under its hyperandrogenism policy but she filed an appeal before the Court of Arbitration for Sports and won it. Recently, under a revised rule of the IAAF, Dutee was left outside the purview of the hyperandrogenism policy which gave her liberty to pursue her career. During the height of controversy relating to hyperandrogenism policy, her most painful time, Prof. Samanta gave her moral support and stood behind her.

My Story ...

'm Dutee Chand the medal winner of Asian Games 2018 held in Jakarta. I won two silver medals in 100m and 200m race. I brought the laurels to the state of Odisha as well as to the nation. All credits for this success go to my well wishers, supporters and guides. Otherwise it would not have been possible for a girl hailing from a very poor weaver family of Jajpur district of Odisha. I am the third child amongst seven siblings. It was very hard for my father Chakradhar Chand to earn even Rs. 2000 – 3000 a month. I started running inspired by my elder sister Saraswati, who is now in Odisha Police.

Earlier also I have won medals for the country in different events. In 2016, I was the first Indian female athlete in 36 years to qualify for the 100m dash in Olympics as I qualified for Rio Olympics through the XVI G Kosanov Memorial International Meet in Almaty, Kazakhstan. I won Bronze Medal in Asian Athletics Championships, Bhubaneswar in 2017; Gold Medal in Asian Junior

Athletics Championships in Taipei and Bronze in Asian Athletics Championships held in Pune. At 17, I was setting records on the track. In 2013, I became the first Indian to reach the final of an international 100m event, at the IAAF World Youth Championships. Then I became the senior national champion in 100m and 200m. In 2014, I won two gold medals at the Asian Junior Championships in Taipei, a first for an Indian athlete.

It has not been easy to reach this point and my life has been full of struggle. I faced many challenges all these years, but was never distracted from my

goal due to all types of support and guidance from Prof. Achyuta Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS till today.

In 2013 I wanted to pursue +3 graduation after completing my +2. I told my story to my coach Shri Siba

Prasad Mishra. He advised me to take admission in Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT). But it was not possible on my part to take admission in KIIT. My coach, Shri Mishra met Dr. Gaganendu Dash, Director-Sports, KIIT and talked to him about me. Shri Mishra told Dr. Dash, "Dutee is a very good athlete, please talk to Prof. Samanta and arrange her admission in KIIT". Dr. Dash agreed and my coach gave all my certificates of sports success to him. He went through my records and approached Samanta Sir for my education in KIIT. In 2013, at the age of 17, my record was at par with India's fastest sprinter P. T. Usha.

Dr. Dash informed Samanta Sir, "Dutee's record is very good. She might be qualifying for Olympics. We should support her so that she could do better in future". Samanta sir agreed and I got the chance to take admission in KIIT. From this point my actual career as a sprinter began. After getting admission in KIIT, I got success after success in various competitions. Samanta sir took my entire responsibilities. He has even supported my family during the time of our distress.

In this regard, I could recall some important incidents in my life. In 2013, when I was preparing for Asian Athletic Meet, I



was in need for special running shoes (spike) to run on the track. I told Samanta sir about this, though I have rarely asked anything directly from him. Whatever I need, I request through Gaganendu sir. He arranged the spikes through Samanta sir. This was the first gift of Samanta sir to me. I



participated in Asian Athletic Meet and for the first time won International Medal running in these spikes. I felt very happy. KIIT and Samanta sir have always proved lucky for me. Wherever I go to participate in National or International Athletic Meet, I take some gift from Samanta sir, as it proves lucky for me. This time, in Jakarta, I wore the track suit of KIIT at the medal presentation ceremony.

Samanta sir has always guided and supported me in every sphere. He has always given me financial and moral support throughout my career till today. The year 2014 was the most painful for me. When I was preparing for Commonwealth Games, I missed out on competition due to the IAAF hyperandrogenism policy. But no one informed me about the issue. I was instructed to vacate the sports hostel, where I was staying and preparing for Commonwealth Games. With such behaviour of the sports authority, I was astonished and completely broken down. When no one was with me due to this problem, only Samanta sir stood behind me and gave moral support.

By learning about my problem, he immediately talked to me and advised me not to bother and to keep patience. He assured to give all type of financial and legal support to fight the case. At the time of distress, Samanta sir reached out to me like God. Whatever Samanta sir says, he makes it success.

I had got a job in Indian Railways due to my success in sports. At that time the railway authority also questioned my gender and asked me for proof. I had to face insult from many quarters. At this juncture of my life, Samanta sir stood behind me. Samanta sir loves me like my parents. He told me, "Dutee, don't bother. If anybody will not give you job, KIIT is there; KIIT will take care of you. KIIT will employ you as a coach." This assurance of Samanta sir doubled my courage. I got mental courage and felt that I can surely succeed in this endeavour. I fought my case in the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAAS), Switzerland. I went to Switzerland. Samanta sir arranged entire travel and legal expenses for me. The judgment went in my favour and in favour of other sports persons of the world who were victims of hyperandrogenism policy. They also got justice due to me.

Samanta sir always guides me from point to point. On a few occasions, I gave some negative statements and remarks as I was mentally disturbed. But Samanta sir advised me not to be influenced by negative thoughts. He always says me that, my sports performance will be affected by negative thoughts and statements. Many times I also have felt that. I can recall one incident. For the first time when I got success in Asian Athletic Meet, I got some cash prize. I bought some cars with this cash for business purpose, as the financial condition of family was not good. When Samanta sir came to know about this, he told me, "Dutee, why have you bought so many cars? You will be busy with various problems of these cars. It will hamper your career. Better you sell the cars at cost price to KIIT. If you don't want sell the cars, you may give it to KIIT on hire basis. Don't go to track with vehicle tension". I felt it is true. So I did as per advice of Samanta Sir, for which I have been getting success after success.

In another incident, recently, after my selection for Asian Games, my coach N. Ramesh sir was accompanying me in my Jakarta tour. In Jakarta, he was not permitted to go till

the track. For this Govt. approval was necessary. I requested Samanta sir to make arrangements, so that my coach could go up to the track. Samanta sir requested Govt. of India and permission was granted to my coach to accompany with me till track. My coach N. Ramesh sir is always with me from the beginning of my career. He always guides me in each and every point from SAI to Gopichand Academy of Hyderabad as a coach.

Whenever I am in Bhubaneswar, I stay in KIIT guest house. During this period, I faced some problems regarding postal correspondence. I approached Samanta sir to allot me a separate house in Bhubaneswar. Sir arranged a big house for me immediately. I and my family are staying there. Not only this, whenever I need anything and ask Samanta sir, he has been fulfilling my need without any hesitation. Once I requested sir to give a job to my brother in KIIT, Samanta sir also fulfilled that. Any health problem of any of my family, sir has arranged free medical treatment for them in KIMS. I will never forget Samanta sir's support and guidance.

And lastly, I thank Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha and Govt. of Odisha for their support and cash prize of Rs. 3 crore. Shri Patnaik and Govt of Odisha have always been supporting me. For this I have been obliged to Hon'ble Chief Miniser Shri Naveen Patnaik. I also thank Hon'ble President of India, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Hon'ble Governor of Odisha, Hon'ble Ministers and all of my well wishers and


KITT & KISS STUDENTS IN ASIAN GAMES 2018


KIIT and KISS have produced many sportspersons in multiple disciplines who have been regularly participating in international sports meet, including Olympics, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games, etc. In the 18th Asian Games in Jakarta, four students from KIIT & KISS – all girls – have been selected to represent the country.











How did you start your sports career?

A: My father used to play badminton in our colony and I used to watch the match till late night. He felt my interest and taught me how to play. Within a year, I got selected for the State Under 13 to play national.

> How do you manage your studies when you are playing or on tour?

A: I carry books with me and spend one hour for study everyday while on tour. I try to remember the best out of it.

What was the turning point in your life?

A: In Senior National - 2017 in Patna, I was playing doubles with my younger sister Swetaparna under supervision of Mr. Arun Vishnu who was the Chief doubles coach of Gopichand Academy, Hyderabad. He asked me to join the academy immediately for doubles batch for one month on trial basis. He prepared me to play three all India ranking tournaments and I was the champion in all of the three tournaments. Subsequently, I was selected for the Academy.

Any important lesson or motivational words you always carry in your mind? Who give those motivational words?

A: "One day your hard work will take you to the top" is the motivational words, always my father used to repeat.

Tell us about your family and support?

A: My father sacrificed his small business and almost 10 years of his valuable life for my sports career. My younger sister also helped me a lot.

What was your major defeat?

A: We lost to Chinese opponents in Malaysia International Challenge in April 2018 after a long fight. It was a major defeat for us. I could not control myself for some time after the match. But afterwards I managed myself.



Why defeat is important in everyone's life?

A: Defeat teaches us the lesson on how to win.

What is your dream?

A: Getting Olympic medal for India in women doubles category.

What would you like to say to girls who want to enter

A: There is no shortcut to success. It is hard work, discipline, dedication and determination which will put you in the top. They should dream big and before starting the sports career set a goal in their mind for which they have to be prepared and work hard.

A: My father in initial days. Now Prof. Achyuta Samanta, Founder, KIIT & KISS is taking care of all of my sports related requirements.

KISS emerged as Champion in Under 13 International Rugby Tournament held in Manchester, U.K. from 19th to 23rd June 2011. KISS U-13 Team, which has been raised recently, won this prestigious title by overcoming stiff challenge from teams from six countries, including South Africa, Thailand, England and Tobago & Trinidad. KISS defeated Thailand by a margin of 5 - 0 in the Final match played on June 23. In the opening match on June 19, KISS Boys had humbled England team on their home turf by a margin of 7 - 0. Subsequently, the team defeated another team from England by 7 – 1 to prove that its opening match feat was no fluke. KISS team stormed into Final after beating South Africa by 3 -0 in Semi Final.

Under-13 Girls Rugby Team of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), representing India, bagged the champion's trophy in the final match of Touraid U-13 Girls International Rugby Tournament 2014 played in Saracens' Allianz Park, London, UK from March 5 - 15 2014. The tournament had participation of eight international teams. Teams from Brazil, Colombia, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China, St Lucia, Trinidad & Tobago, Swaziland and Uganda took part. KISS was representing India. In addition, 12 teams from UK participated.

KISS India Rugby Team outplayed South Africa 19-05 in London to win the Under 14 Rugby World Cup in 2007. The Jungle Crows, as the KISS Rugby Team was called, had started off as underdogs in the tournament, playing a foreign sport on a foreign turf. But what they possessed in plenty was a passion to win for India. And they stunned Zambia, Swaziland, Kenya and Romania to top the Group B and set up a tough title clash with South Africa. Cambodia, Ruwanda, Maldowa and Kazaksthan were the other international teams participating.

KIIT Sends 100 Member Team of Doctors & Skilled Workers to Kerala

Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), Bhubaneswar has sent 100-member team, comprising of doctors and skilled workers, to support medical service and rebuilding of infrastructure in the flood ravaged regions of Kerala. A 25member medical team of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) was despatched on August 22, 2018 to render health services to the flood victims. Subsequently, a team of 75 skilled workers from KIIT left for Kerala on August 24 to support floodaffected people of the State.

Massive floods in Kerala have devastated the entire state affecting more than 10 lakh people. While the water has now receded, fears have been growing over the outbreak of diseases. The flooding damaged or destroyed thousands of homes in hundreds of villages, requiring a massive restoration effort.

KIMS has allocated Rs. 10 lakh towards the tour expenditure of the Medical Team. KIMS Medical Team as well as the team of skilled workers, which includes electricians, plumbers, welders, A/C mechanics, etc., will stay in Ernakulam, Alappuzha, Thrissur and Kottayam districts for one month and provide medical services and support rehabilitation and restoration efforts. Raja Raman of KIIT is the convenor for the medical team. All the 25 members of the team are working as doctors in KIMS. All of them belong to Kerala and Tamilnadu.

"We are deeply saddened by the calamity that has hit Kerala. Our heart goes out to all who have suffered loss. We are very happy to hear about people who are helping the victims", said Prof. Achyuta Samanta at the send-off ceremony of KIIT & KIMS teams. About IUAES World Congress

The IUAES is a world organization of scientists and institutions working in the fields of anthropology and ethnology, but also of interest to archaeologists and linguists, among others. Its aim is to enhance exchange and communication among scholars of all regions of the world, in a collective effort to expand human knowledge. In this way it hopes to contribute to a better understanding of human society, and to a sustainable future based on harmony between nature and culture. The IUAES was established on 23 August 1948, when it was brought into one organization, de facto, with the International Congress of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences (ICAES), which was itself founded in 1934. The latter was the follower of various Congresses of Anthropological Sciences, starting in 1865, the President of the Congress also serving as the President of the Union. The two organizations were united, de jure, in 1968.

Through its major Congress (called ICAES until 2008, and subsequently renamed World Congress), held every five years, the IUAES provides a world forum for the discussion and dissemination of research. In the period between world congresses, it also sponsors Inter-Congresses, seminars and symposia, and encourages the participation of anthropologists in other international meetings and projects. Through its Scientific Commissions, the IUAES stimulates the convergence of research interests among anthropologists, and the dissemination of research findings through publications.










Book by Shri Bhagwat Pariwar, 'Apratim Bharat', Released by Hon'ble Governor of Odisha




